had the opportunity to be a part of, and which will stay with me for a very long time to come.

Remembrance is not always easy or straightforward. Each November we are asked to 'remember' those who have fought and died in wars, but remembering those long dead and known only by name on a war memorial is sometimes difficult, despite the will to honour them and their sacrifice.

When the idea to incorporate our Armistice commemorations into a short drama based on Teddington residents who fought and

died in the War and their families, was suggested, I immediately knew I wanted to be involved. Then when I read Cathy Randall's poignant script, and heard the voices of these men, and their loved ones, it was impossible not to be moved, not only by their words and their stories, but also by the obvious connection to us as modern day residents of Teddington. The familiarity of the street names and other significant locations around Teddington offered us a connection with these people, which somehow made their lives very real and immediate.

As rehearsals progressed, we began to bring to life the experiences of the people we were portraying. The interactions between friends and family members, and the reading aloud of their correspondence enabled us all to walk in their shoes, and empathise with their suffering.

Telling their stories was an honour and a privilege, and seeing so many people gathered in the Landmark on 11<sup>th</sup> November to hear those stories was a very special experience.
