Vicar's Viewpoint

The Church of St Peter and St Paul sits at the heart of our community on the crossroads of our busiest streets. Its future is therefore of interest to everyone. As some important developments are afoot, I'd like to clarify what is changing and what is remaining the same.

What is changing is that on Sunday March 8th the regular congregation, being relatively small in number, will be worshipping for the last time in the church before merging with the congregation at St Mary with St Alban. After March 8th there will no longer be a Sunday morning service until such time as a new worshipping community is

What is not changing is that the building will remain a church and there will still be a regular weekday service and some Sunday evening worship. The adjacent hall will still be available to all the organisations and community groups that currently use it. The vicarage in Bychurch End will still be used for clergy housing and we (the congregations from both churches) remain committed to using all our buildings for our core purpose of 'growing faith and friendship'. St Peter and St Paul will continue to be a consecrated church, open to all and looked after by the Church of England in the service of everyone in our community.

What is exciting is that we have plans to start a Community Café in St Peter and St Paul in the church, not the hall, on Monday afternoons, beginning in May. More details will follow next month. We also have plans for a new Sports Ministry starting in September which may well be based there as well. I personally look forward to the merger of the congregations which I believe will be of benefit to both. There will be a special 'Coming Together Service' on March 15th at St Mary with St Alban.

The story of St Peter and St Paul is by no means finished. It is merely moving into a new phase. To mark the transition, the service on March 8th will be entitled 'A People on the Move' and we'd be delighted to see anyone with a connection to the church as we share stories and pray for the next stage of the journey.

Lent Appeal – School rebuilding in Mozambique

This time last year I visited our link parish of Pemba in the far north of Mozambique. One of the highlights of my trip was visiting the only Anglican church school in the region. This was a primary school in a remote village called Chimoio. Much like our own school (St Mary's and St Peter's) it had 700 children, but in most other respects it was very different. It had only had 7 teachers and 3 classrooms, so the children were split between morning and afternoon classes. They were very proud of the three classrooms which had been newly built, since before then the lessons were all taught under a tree.

A month after my trip, Cyclone Kenneth hit the region causing massive wind damage and flooding. The walls of the new school building were swept away in the floods, leaving a twisted roof. The villagers were greatly affected, losing homes and harvests. Thankfully, church workers provided emergency food and people have been rebuilding their homes. The school has reopened but they are having to function without buildings, working once again with lessons under the tree.

Now the local church would like to rebuild the school. This will cost something in the region of £20,000. St Mary's and St Peter's

has made a terrific start and at a recent assembly I was presented with a cheque for £5,000. Some of this came from donations made by parents and visitors at the Harvest and Christmas events, but an incredible £3,026 was raised by Year 6 (see Year Six Grow a Pound on next page).

Our Lent Appeal this year will aim to double the SMSP total, raising another £5,000. We hope that the rest of the money needed will come from grants. If vou would like to donate, please contribute by:

#LiveLent: Care for God's Creation

This is the Church of England's Campaign for 2020. It comes with booklets for both adults and children, which we Joe with Ruth Valerio at the recent Supper Talk Sunday in Lent.

These include daily readings and reflections. There is also a free app for those who prefer a digital version.

The theme is to 'Care for Creation'. It is commended by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York who invite us 'to rebuild our relationship with our planet, and with the God who is Lord of everything.' During this time, we hope you might spend time praying, learning more about the remarkable world we have been given and building habits that last beyond the season to protect and honour the earth.'

The booklets have been based on an excellent book entitled 'Saving Yes to Life' by Tearfund Director Ruth Valerio, who was quest speaker at our last Supper Talk. Ruth takes the days of creation as described in Genesis Chapter 1 and she gives fascinating examples of the intricate beauty of creation as well as sobering stories about pollution and the effects of climate change. Each chapter ends with extremely helpful suggestions of how we might change habits and attitudes.

If you would like to explore this theme with others, we are offering a Lent Course on Wednesday mornings which will be based on these resources. Each session will be based on a chapter of the book, but you won't need to read the book to participate. The course will be led by myself, Caroline Halmshaw and Sarah Williams and will run for five sessions from March 4th to April 1st, 10.30am-12noon in the Mina Hogan Room, St Mary's Parish Hall. Please let us know whether you wish to participate by signing the sheet at the back of church or contacting the parish office.
