## Vicar's Viewpoint

I've just been doing our annual report to the diocese which includes the number of funerals we've taken. And the figures tell their own story: 2018: 23 2020: 31

2019: 21 2021: 27

Some of these in the last two years have been Covidrelated in the cause of death. Many have not, and we've just had a very sad number of deaths from other causes. But all of them have been Covidaffected in the sense that Covid has made matters far worse for grieving families and friends.

I'm therefore very mindful of all those who have been recently bereaved. Many have found that they were unable to have the funeral or memorial service that they wanted because of restrictions. And many have found themselves isolated when they most needed companionship. So I've been especially keen to see support services offered. I've worked with our local GP Social Prescribing team to offer bereavement courses. And it's been good to do various events (including parkrun and carol singing) with our local funeral directors and celebrants to raise awareness of *The Good Grief Trust*. This provides a 'one-stop-shop' website with all the details of bereavement services in your local area: *www.thegoodgrieftrust.org* 

This month we're also offering our first parish bereavement course. *The Bereavement Journey* is a 6 week course for anyone who has lost a loved one at any time and in any way. The sessions gently guide bereaved people through the most common aspects of grief, allowing them both the time and a safe space to talk about and process their loss. The course will start on 22nd February 12-1pm at St. Peter and St. Paul Church. It will be led by Sarah Williams (our Ordinand), Rev Chris Kennedy (Activate Wellbeing Minister) and myself. Children from St Mary with St Alban's Children's Church produced a design for a Christmas Card. St Mary's with St Peter's school, local Church congregations and the Church's Guide company generously collected gifts to be delivered along with the food.

As well as our main funder, the Hampton Fund, whose £900 generous donation covered the cost of the food, drinks and sundry items, we also had a number of local companies who provided us with goods.

On Christmas day our team of twenty five volunteer drivers delivered to each quest a food bag, which contained two microwaveable plastic boxes. In the boxes were a full Christmas Dinner with all the trimmings and a dessert. There was also a drink, fruit, and cheese. They were also given a bag containing Christmas presents and a selection of chocolates, mince pies, jams, calendars and biscuits.



The limiting factor for the number guests we can serve is usually the seating capacity of the hall. As that did not apply this year, we were able to offer Christmas dinners to a wider clientele. We took families referred from Welcare, a charity supporting families and Ruils, a local charity supporting disabled children and adults and people with long term health and mental health conditions.

The feedback we received from all those involved in delivering, and from the recipients, was extremely positive and arateful.
