## Teddington and the Queen

Richmond is a Royal Borough and the Queen visited the borough on a number of occasions. However she only paid one official visit to Teddington during her reign. That was on June 25th 2002 when she and the Duke of Edinburgh came to the 'Picnic in the Park' in Bushy Park, organised to celebrate her Golden Jubilee. There will be many residents who remember the day clearly.



Many, car enthusiasts particularly, will recall the slow and sedate progress of the royal

Rolls Royce gliding slowly into and around the Park, with the Queen and Duke clearly visible.

The Queen showed great interest in the Park, the river and all the connections that the Royal Parks have had to the monarchy over the years. As the event involved about 40,000 people, there were many who were able to meet or, at least, see the Queen.

## **Community Café**

This is some of the feedback received from visitors to our Community Café, which is open on Mondays from 1.304.30pm at the Peter and Paul Centre, in the centre of Teddington.

From the outset we wanted the Café to be more than just another coffee shop, being there for anyone who fancies a chat, particularly those feeling socially isolated and anxious. Given the focus on promoting mental health, we work closely with Ruils (Richmond-Upon-Thames Independent Living Service) whose NHS link workers often come to meet clients at the Café. It has been lovely to see people come, meet others and over the weeks develop lasting friendships. Our customers range in age from nonagenarians to new-borns (with their mothers) and newcomers are always welcome.

We have started a book swap scheme and sell local jams and marmalades. The Café is also the ideal place to signpost local organisations offering interesting activities and valuable services. Now Covid restrictions have eased, we hope to do more of this in the future.
