

Vicar's Viewpoint

It seems that the world is getting progressively darker – or else my eyesight is failing in my dotage. Wars, political machinations, threats of terror, the mental cost of social media – the burden of these and other factors

feels heavier and the darkness greater.

However, thankfully and joyously we approach Christmas. The fury of the people will be focused upon our retailers (itself not good, either, for the record). Santa will be released from furlough and maybe even yes, a little baby Jesus-ing will occur.

For us in churches, we are getting ready for the arrival of the Christ-child. St John, in the words that we will read at midnight on Christmas night, says: the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. For Christians, Jesus is the light, a light that at its first appearing did so in a world as torn yet still as beautiful as ours is today. That light not only shone then, but lit up the world for the millennia that have followed – and it is that light we kindle in the coming weeks.

Whatever darkness is encroaching upon you, know this: the light always triumphs. Power, religion, status, money – all will wither and perish but, and to let Thomas Traherne have the last word: there will be one equal light.

I pray that the light of Christ shines upon you and all those you love this Christmas.

Celebrating Thomas Traherne

St Mary's has been remembering the life of Thomas Traherne (1635-1674), the little -known Hereford-born great metaphysical poet and priest who died and was buried beneath the lectern in the church three hundred and fifty years ago.

The first event, in October, comprised an account of his life story; an excellent selection of readings of Traherne's poetry and prose; a talk by Oxford Professor Sarah Hutton entitled *Ethicks*, and another by the former Bishop of Oxford Richard Harries on Traherne's *Thanksgivings*, several Traherne themed organ pieces; and some choral works, which included

settings composed by our Director of Music Derek Saunders.

The second event, in November, was *A Musical Journey with Thomas Traherne and Contemporaries*, performed by our augmented church choir (directed by Derek Saunders) and accompanied by the Teddington Consort (led by Janet Smith). This programme included music by Handel and Purcell, as well as modern composers, but inspired by the profoundly perceptive and spiritual writings of Traherne and other 17th century poets such as Donne, Herbert, Vaughan, Milton and Shakespeare. The evening raised £500 for the Building Anew project.

Attenders at both events were most appreciative and it was lovely to win new friends through the medium of words and music so interestingly presented.
