THE GOSPEL READING – *Luke 2.1-14,15-20*

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

All Glory to you, O Lord.

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register.

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line

of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.

There were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest,

and on earth peace to men on whom his favour rests."

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you

All and also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

All We lift them to the Lord.

It is right to praise you, Father, Lord of all creation; in your love you made us for yourself. When we turned away you did not reject us, but came to meet us in your Son.

All You embraced us as your children and welcomed us to sit and eat with you.

In Christ you shared our life that we might live in him and he in us.

All He opened his arms of love upon the cross and made for all the perfect sacrifice for sin.

On the night he was betrayed, at supper with his friends he took bread, and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to them, saying:

*Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you;
do this in remembrance of me.*

All Father, we do this in remembrance of him: his body is the bread of life.

At the end of supper, taking the cup of wine, he gave you thanks, and said:

As we proclaim his death and celebrate his rising in glory, send your ✠ Holy Spirit that this bread and this wine may be to us the body and blood of your dear Son.

We are here for you every day but we gather for services across the year at the following times:

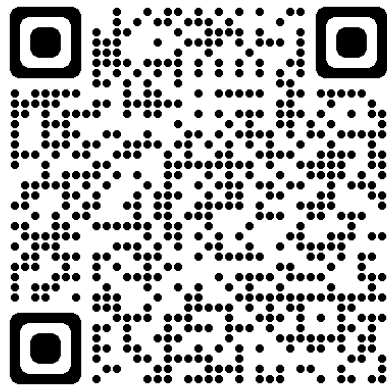
Sundays

- **8am Holy Communion (BCP 1662)** – a gentle said service
- **9am Morning Worship** a service for young families, but all are welcome. Holy Communion is offered at this service on the second Sunday, and each week we follow the service with Coffee & Craft in the parish Hall
- **10am Parish Eucharist** – this service features hymns and a sermon and is supported by our talented choir. Children's Church takes place alongside this service and we gather for refreshments together afterwards. On the third Sunday of the month, this service is an All-Age Service when we worship together young and older.
- **630pm Choral Evensong** – on the third Sunday of the month, we offer a traditional Evensong from the Book of Common Prayer, normally supported by our choir.

- **1030am Church Mice** for toddlers and those who chase behind them. Refreshments are offered after this short interactive service

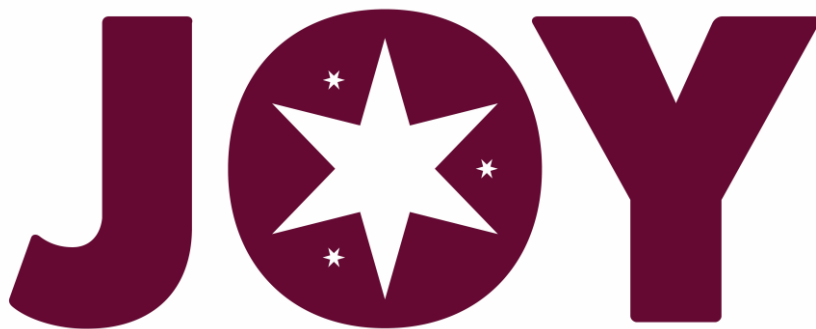
Monday to Saturday – **Morning and Evening Prayer** are shared on Zoom. Go to teddingtonparish.org/whats-on for more details
