PLAYWAM GET BUSY IN THE CHURCHYARD

Children from Playwam Preschool enjoyed a special visit to the churchyard recently as part of their curriculum learning about nature, healthy living, and caring for their local community. The children planted sunflowers, wildflowers, and herbs in the Sensory Garden, learning about how plants grow, the importance of pollination, and how flowers and herbs support bees and other wildlife. They also talked about healthy eating and where some of our food comes from.

Fr. David was on hand to show the children the churchyard bee hives and also introduce Sally Stones, who leads the churchyard gardening team.

STRONG COMMUNITY LINKS

St Mary's and St Peter's Primary School is proud of its long-standing and deeply valued relationship with St Mary with St Alban Church—a partnership that has been at the heart of the Teddington community since the school was established in 1831.

Over the decades, the church has played a vital role in school life. Clergy and parish members have contributed significantly to its development, and this strong connection continues today. Rev. Mary Hawes serves as Chair of Governors, while Fr. David Cloake is an Ex-officio Governor in his role as Vicar. Alongside them, Foundation Governors from the parish give their time and expertise to help guide the school's strategic direction.

This relationship extends well beyond governance. Throughout the year, pupils regularly visit the Church for key services including Harvest, Christmas, Easter and Pentecost. These occasions bring together children, staff, families and the wider parish community, creating shared experiences that are both meaningful and memorable.

The link is equally strong within the school. Clergy, including Fr. David, Rev. Mary and Rev. Joy, are familiar and welcome visitors, leading Collective Worship and supporting Religious Education, bringing faith to life for pupils.

At the heart of this partnership is a shared commitment to community—one of the school's core values - bringing people together, supporting one another and nurturing a strong sense of belonging for all.

TEDDINGTON RNLI FACTS



Another neighbour, also at the heart of this community, is the RNLI. Did you know:

- Teddington is one of the RNLI's newest lifeboat stations, one of the first to cover a river rather than estuarial waters/sea, and is one of four stations on the Thames
- All of the crew at Teddington RNLI are volunteers
- About thirty men and women are active crew members
- About sixty people volunteer at the Teddington station
- The RNLI is a charity and receives no government funding
- The RNLI lifeboat stations on the Thames will celebrate 25 years next year
